



RESOLUTION OF THE REJECTION OF THE APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS CORRESPONDING TO THE APPLICATION PROCESS FOR THE AWARDING OF GRANTS (ON THE BASIS OF COMPETITIVE TENDERING) FOR THE PUBLICATION OF CHILDREN'S AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S PICTURE BOOKS ABROAD CORRESPONDING TO THE SECOND TERM OF 2015.

Ref. 02/ L0126 U10 2T INADMISSIONS - LIJ 2015

Facts

1. On 9 March 2015 (DOGC no. 6831 of 16 March 2015) and in a modification on 10 April 2015 (DOGC no. 6856 of 22 April 2015) and on 3 June 2015 (DOGC no. 6893 of 16 June 2015) the director of the Institut Ramon Llull ruled to open the application process for the awarding of grants (on the basis of competitive tendering) for the publication of children's and young people's picture books abroad in 2015.
2. The applications submitted within the time limit stipulated by the application process are detailed herein.
3. The assessment committee met on 1 October 2015 to study and nominate the submitted applications.

Legal Grounds

1. The General Grants Act (Law 38/2003 of 17 November) and Royal Decree 887/2006, of 21 July, approving the Regulations for said Act.
2. Legislative Decree 3/2002, of 24 December, approving the revised text of the Public Finance Act of Catalonia.
3. Government Agreement 110/2014, of 22 July, which approves the model regarding types of regulatory rules for procedures regarding grants on the basis of competitive tendering, processed by the Administrative Body of the Generalitat and its public sector.
4. Rule 12, which governs the awarding of grants by the Institut Ramon Llull for the publication of children's and young people's picture books abroad, regulates the rejection and withdrawal of the applications.
5. In accordance with rule 12.3 of the rules that govern the application process, which establishes it falls upon the examining body to reach a decision regarding the rejection of the applications submitted,

Resolution

Accordingly I resolve,

To reject the grant applications listed in the Annex.



Admissible Appeals

This resolution does not exhaust the administrative channels for appeal and, in accordance with Articles 114 and 115 of the Legal Framework for Public Administrations and Common Administrative Procedure Act (Law 30/1992, of 26 November) and Article 18.1 of the Statutes of the Institut Ramon Llull, an appeal for the matter to be passed to a higher authority may be lodged with the Director of the Institut Ramon Llull within a period of one month from the day this resolution is published.

The committee proposes to reject the application submitted by Mateja Suznik S.P. for Emilia Lang's illustration of the Portuguese edition of the book *Senyora Maria*, by Cesc Noguera, given that it fails to comply with rule 1.1 of the rules governing this application process. Rule 1.1 stipulates that the book for which aid is sought cannot have been published in the language for which the grant is requested prior to the date the resolution awarding the grant is issued. The book for which the grant is sought has already been published.

In addition, the application for a grant submitted by Mateja Suznik S.P. fails to comply with rule 8 of the rules that govern this application process. Rule 8 stipulates that the deadline for applications is set during the grant application process. The application process stipulates that the deadline for submitting applications is the 18 September 2015. Mateja Suznik S.P. submitted the application to the Institut Ramon Llull on 23 September 2015.
